NASW PRESS CALL FOR BOOK PROPOSALS

Authors are invited to submit proposals for scholarly works, textbooks, reference works, practice books, and guidebooks.

NASW Press particularly seeks book proposals including, but not limited to, the following topics:

- Men's health issues
- Elder care
- Immigration/refugees
- Substance abuse/addictive behaviors
- Youth development (with a focus on violence among girls and gangs)
- Grief/loss/trauma
- Caregiving
- HIV/AIDS
- Adoption/foster care

PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

The proposal should be no longer than six, double-spaced, typed pages in 12-point font; it must contain vital information about the book and establish a clear rationale or purpose for the book and describe how the author will accomplish the purpose. The proposal must demonstrate that the author has enough comprehensive, valid material to justify a book, rather than a journal article. Features that make the book unique should be described.
